Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Common from near Dumbleyung S to near Boxwood Hill (c. 50 km due SSW of Jerramungup) and E to Kumarl–Scaddan area (Norseman–Esperance) in south-western W.A.

Description

Phyllodes mostly 8–14 cm long, 1–1.5 mm diam., dark green; **pulvinus** flared at base and wider than base of **phyllode**-blade. Flower-heads mostly 50–70-flowered; bracteoles neither dark coloured nor obviously **exserted**. Sepals half or less the length of the 2/3–3/4-united petals.

Habitat

Grows in yellow, orange-yellow or pale brown sand, sandy or gravelly loam or reddish granitic loam, often in association with granite, less commonly with laterite, in *Casuarina* scrub, *Eucalyptus* woodland, heathland or on open sandplains.
