Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Occurs from near Eneabba S to Mundijong, W.A.

Description

Terminal **seta** 2-8 mm long; apex of **pinna-rachis** flattened and **recurved**; pinnules (3-) 4-7 (-8) mm long, green to grey-green, hirsutellous to subglabrous. **Calyx** lobes ciliolate and with a few additional very long hairs which are **exserted** in the buds.

Habitat

Grows in sandy loam, sand, gravel and clay, sometimes in winter wet depressions, in heath and open Jarrah (*Eucalyptus marginata*) or Wandoo (*E. wandoo*) woodland.
