Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Disjunct, occurring at Wongan Hills and near Newdegate, W.A.

Description

Terminal *seta* 1–2 mm long; apex of *pinna rachis* straight or recurved, not flattened; pinnules 2–4 mm long, normally glaucous, hirsutellous. *Calyx* lobes ciliate.

Habitat

Grows in sand, gravel, gravelly sand and sandy clay, in open heath, scrub and shrubland.

Specimens

W.A.: 17 km E of Newdegate towards Lake King, *B.R.Maslin 3432* (CANB, PERTH); 3.5 km N of Wongan Hills, *E.M.Scrymgeour 2095* (CANB, PERTH).
