Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Infrequent from Westonia S to near Dunn Swamp but locally common in Kulin area, south-western W.A.

Description

Shrub not obviously resinous. Phyllodes elliptic to oblong-elliptic or oblanceolate, mostly 1.5–2.2 cm long, 3–6 mm wide, 2–3 times as long as wide, mostly obviously tomentulose. Bracteoles ovate to lanceolate, long-pedicellate, exerted in buds.

Habitat

In low eucalypt woodland in poorly to well drained clay loam or brown sand.
