

Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Scattered in a restricted area in the Holt Rock district, c. 100 km N of the typical subspecies.

Description

Phyllodes inequilaterally **obtriangular** to **obdeltate** (**adaxial** margin with conspicuous **rounded** angle above the middle), 1–2.5 cm long, 1–1.5 cm wide, with apical point sharply **pungent**. Peduncles 0.5–1 cm long, in 2–8-headed racemes 1–3.5 cm long; heads 5 or 6-flowered.

Habitat

Grows in lateritic gravel, in woodland or heath.
