Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Widespread in central Vic. from Skipton NE to near Bendigo and E to Licola. A single collection made in 1922, labelled 'Grampians', requires confirmation.

Description

Branchlets with \pm sparse, closely appressed hairs. Phyllodes mostly narrowly elliptic, (1.5–) 3–6 cm long, 2–8 (–10) mm wide, mostly straight to shallowly recurved, with anastomoses occasional to few or occasionally absent; gland 3–10 mm above pulvinus. Peduncles (1–) 2–4 mm long (heads often superficially sessile at anthesis), glabrous or sometimes sparsely appressed puberulous; flower-heads \pm 5 mm long, 4.5 mm diam.

Habitat

Occurs in shrubland with scattered trees, as far as known.

Specimens

Vic.: Glenelg Hwy, 24 km SW of Ballarat and just E of Linton, *T.B.Muir 2148* (MEL).
