Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Known only from the Ravensthorpe area and Ravensthorpe Ra., southern W.A.

Description

Phyllodes **obovate** to **oblong-oblancoelate**, flat, (3–) 4–7.5 mm wide, **rounded-obtuse**, with 1–3 (–5) main nerves per face. Pods smooth, **coriaceous**.

Habitat

Grows in loam, clay or laterite, on low hills, with *Eucalyptus tetraptera* or *Allocasuarina humilis* in dense scrub, commonly in association with granite.

Specimens

W.A.: 7.4 km S of Ravensthorpe towards Hopetoun, *B.R.Maslin 3896* (BM, BRI, G, K, NSW, PERTH); 33.5 km E of Ravensthorpe towards Esperance, *B.R.Maslin 3913* (PERTH); Ravensthorpe Ra., 3 km NE of Kundip, *K.Newbey 9691* (PERTH).
